

The Karlsruhe Pass

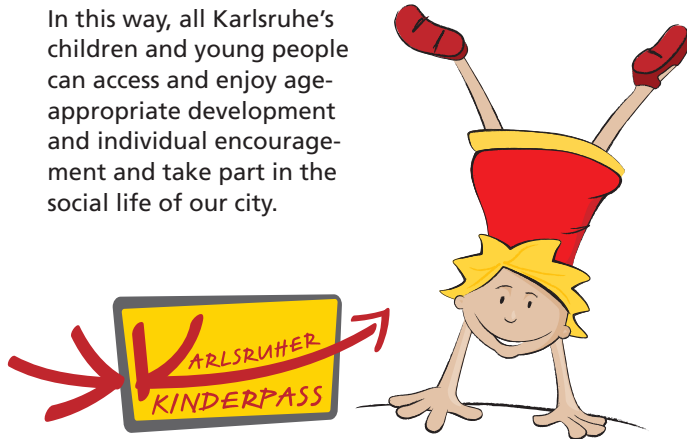
The **Karlsruhe Pass** is based on three pillars – leisure, sport and mobility. It includes free visits to the zoo, a 50% reduction on the entry charges to many civic outdoor and indoor swimming pools, as well as reductions on bus and rail travel – if you use the Karlsruhe Pass, you can get the monthly ticket (Monatskarte) in the Karlsruhe transport system (KVV) customer centres for half the regular price.



The Karlsruhe Children's Pass

The **Karlsruhe Children's Pass** allows girls and boys between the ages of 0-15 years to use what Karlsruhe has to offer in both leisure and education. Alongside the free or reduced price entry into the civic swimming pools, theatres, museums and other facilities, it also includes education vouchers and other benefits/concessions.

In this way, all Karlsruhe's children and young people can access and enjoy age-appropriate development and individual encouragement and take part in the social life of our city.



How to get your Karlsruhe Pass

In order to enable a quick and uncomplicated issuing of passes, we have tried to keep the administration effort to an absolute minimum. This means that when the documentation listed below is presented, each application is processed straight away and the pass issued to you with immediate validity.

Who can get a Karlsruhe Pass?

All those who receive unemployed benefit II or the basic pension are entitled. Also entitled are those with a reduced earning capacity (support in accordance with SGB II, SGB XII), or those in receipt of housing benefit or child benefit/allowance. Please bring originals of the relevant official letters as well as a recent photograph (passport-size) of each person who is entitled.

Who can get a Karlsruhe Children's Pass?

For the children of parents or single parents who fulfill the entitlement requirements for the **Karlsruhe Pass**, it is possible to apply for the **Karlsruhe Children's Pass** at the same time and at the same office without the need to show further evidence.

If you are not entitled to the **Karlsruhe Pass**, your child may still be entitled to a **Karlsruhe Children's Pass**. In this case, i.e. with families on a low income, we need the following documents to evaluate the claim:

- The last three payslips
- Proof of current rent
- Proof of heating expenses
- Proof of maintenance payments
- Proof of any other income (not named here)

In each case, we need a passport-size recent photo of each child.

The Karlsruhe Children's Pass – education vouchers

The city of Karlsruhe wants to give children the opportunity to pursue their interests and to further develop in their own individual areas and the **Karlsruhe Children's Pass** includes vouchers to the value of €100 for this. These vouchers serve a specific purpose and can be redeemed area-wide at all sports clubs adult-education centres, schools of art for children and young people, the Baden conservatoire, and the charity and social service centre. Furthermore, they are valid for all the Karlsruhe town youth committee registered society (Stadtjugendausschuss e.V.) facilities and for a range of tutoring opportunities too.

Further reductions and benefits with the Karlsruhe Children's Pass

You can apply for further benefits (as listed below) from the education and sport office just by presenting the **Karlsruhe Children's Pass**:

- Exemption from supplementary childcare charges
- Reduction when using food money/allowance
- Reduction and/or taking over of the Karlsruhe transport system's "Schoolcard"
- Grants for school trips of longer than five days duration
